This is where the story has some interest. Dealing a big blow to his father, Jelly Roll in 2021 at the age of 37 years performed at the Grand Ole Opry and released his first country album "Ballads of the Broken." The third one, Son of a Sinner, made the top 40 on the Billboard Hot

The transition of hip-hop to country was not a calculated or a fake one. It was authentic evolution.
